1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is (i) to give you the notice of the Annual General Meeting; (ii) to provide you with information regarding (a) the proposed re-election of Directors; and (b) the proposed granting of general mandates to the Directors to exercise the powers of the Company to repurchase Shares and to issue Shares; and (iii) to set out an explanatory statement regarding the Repurchase Mandate.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

2. ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The notice for convening the Annual General Meeting is set out in Appendix I to this circular.

A form of proxy for the Annual General Meeting is enclosed with this circular. Whether or not you are able to attend the Annual General Meeting (or any adjournment thereof) in person, please complete the form of proxy enclosed with this circular in accordance with the instructions printed thereon, and return it to the Company's branch share registrar and transfer office in Hong Kong, Tricor Progressive Limited, at Level 22, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen's Road East, Hong Kong as soon as possible but in any event not less than forty-eight (48) hours before the time appointed for holding the Annual General Meeting (or any adjournment thereof). Completion and return of a form of proxy will not preclude you from attending and voting at the Annual General Meeting (or any adjournment thereof) in person should you so wish.

Pursuant to Rule 13.39(4) of the Listing Rules, any votes of the Shareholders at a general meeting must be taken by poll except where the chairman of the general meeting, in good faith, decides to allow a resolution which relates purely to a procedural or administrative matter to be voted on by a show of hands. The chairman of the Annual General Meeting will therefore demand a poll for every resolution put to the vote of the Annual General Meeting pursuant to Bye-law 66.

The results of the poll will be published after the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting on the websites of the Stock Exchange and of the Company.

The holders of CPS shall be entitled to receive notice and to attend the Annual General Meeting but the CPS shall not confer on their holders the right to vote at the Annual General Meeting, unless a resolution is to be proposed for the winding-up of the Company or a resolution is to be proposed which if passed would vary or abrogate the rights or privileges of the CPS or vary the restrictions to which the CPS are subject.

3. ADOPTION OF THE AUDITED CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND THE REPORTS OF DIRECTORS AND AUDITOR

The Company's 2013 Annual Report (including the audited consolidated financial statements and the reports of Directors and auditor for the year ended 31 December 2013) is sent together with this circular to the Shareholders on the same date. The audited consolidated financial statements of the Company for the year ended 31 December 2013 have been reviewed by the audit committee of the Board.

4. PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF RETIRING DIRECTORS

Pursuant to Bye-law 84(1), at each annual general meeting one-third of the Directors for the time being (or, if their number is not a multiple of three (3), the number nearest to but not less than one-third) shall retire from office by rotation provided that every Director shall be subject to retirement at least once every three years. Pursuant to Bye-law 84(2), a retiring Director shall be eligible for re-election and shall continue to act as a Director throughout the meeting at which he retires. The Directors to retire by rotation shall include (so far as necessary to ascertain the number of directors to retire by rotation) any Director who wishes to retire and not to offer himself for re-election. Any further Directors so to retire shall be those of the other Directors subject to retirement by rotation who have been longest in office since their last re-election or appointment. In this regard, Mr. MA Wangjun, Mr. LAU Hon Chuen Ambrose, GBS, JP, Mr. WU Kwok Cheung, MH, shall retire from office and, being eligible, offer himself for re-election at the Annual General Meeting.

Mr. LAU Hon Chuen, Ambrose, GBS, JP, has served on the Board for more than 9 years. As an independent non-executive Director, Mr. Lau has expressed objective views and exercised independent judgements in fulfilling his duties to the Company during his directorship, and he continues demonstrating a firm commitment to his roles. The nomination committee of the Board considers that the long service of Mr. Lau would not affect his exercise of independent judgement and is satisfied that Mr. Lau has the required character, integrity and experience to continue fulfilling the role of an independent non-executive Director. On 25 March 2014, taking into account the view of the nomination committee of the Board, the Board considered that the re-election of Mr. Lau as independent non-executive Director is in the best interest of the Company and Shareholders as a whole, and recommended Mr. Lau to stand for election as independent non-executive Director at the Annual General Meeting.

Information of Mr. Ma, Mr. Lau and Mr. Wu including their biographical details are set out in Appendix II to this circular.

5. DIRECTORS' REMUNERATION

A proposal shall be put forward for the Shareholders to authorise the Board to fix the Directors' remuneration.

6. RE-APPOINTMENT OF AUDITOR

The Board (which agreed to the view of the audit committee of the Board) recommended that, subject to the approval of the Shareholders at the Annual General Meeting, Deloitte Touche Tohmatsu be re-appointed as the auditor of the Company.

7. PROPOSED GENERAL MANDATE TO REPURCHASE SHARES

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 5 June 2013, a general mandate was given to the Directors to exercise all the powers of the Company to repurchase its own Shares on the Stock Exchange up to 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the ordinary share capital of the Company in issue as at the date of passing the relevant resolution. Such mandate will lapse at the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting.

An ordinary resolution will therefore be proposed at the Annual General Meeting to approve the granting of the Repurchase Mandate to the Directors to repurchase Shares. The aggregate nominal amount of Shares to be purchased pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate shall not exceed 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the ordinary share capital of the Company in issue as at the date of passing the relevant resolution. As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued ordinary share capital of the Company comprised 8,478,732,480 Shares. Subject to the passing of the proposed resolutions and on the basis that there will be no change in respect of the issued ordinary share capital of the Company between the Latest Practicable Date and the date of the Annual General Meeting where the relevant resolution is proposed to be passed, the maximum number of Shares which can be repurchased pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate will be 847,873,248 Shares, representing 10% of the issued ordinary share capital of the Company.

In accordance with the Listing Rules, the Company is required to send to the Shareholders an explanatory statement containing all the information reasonably necessary to enable the Shareholders to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the resolution to approve the repurchase by the Company of its own Shares. The explanatory statement required by the Listing Rules is set out in Appendix III to this circular.

8. PROPOSED GENERAL MANDATE TO ISSUE SHARES

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 5 June 2013, a general mandate was given to the Directors to exercise all the powers of the Company to allot, issue and deal with Shares not exceeding 20% of the aggregate nominal amount of the ordinary share capital of the Company in issue as at the date of passing the relevant resolution. Such mandate will lapse at the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting.

At the Annual General Meeting, resolutions will be proposed granting to the Directors the Issue Mandate to allot, issue and deal with Shares not exceeding 20% of the aggregate nominal amount of the ordinary share capital of the Company in issue as at the date of passing the relevant resolution, and adding to such general mandate so granted to the Directors an amount equal to the aggregate nominal amount of Shares repurchased by the Company pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate. The Directors have no present intention to exercise the general mandate to issue Shares if such mandate is granted.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued ordinary share capital of the Company comprised 8,478,732,480 Shares. Subject to the passing of the proposed resolutions and on the basis that there will be no change in respect of the issued ordinary share capital of the Company between the Latest Practicable Date and the date of the Annual General Meeting where the relevant resolution is proposed to be passed, the Company would be allowed to issue a maximum of 1,695,746,496 Shares, representing 20% of the issued ordinary share capital of the Company as at the date of passing the relevant resolution, which may be increased by the number of Shares which may be repurchased pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate.

The Repurchase Mandate and Issue Mandate will continue in force until whichever is the earliest of: (i) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company; (ii) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the Bye-laws or any applicable law to be held; and (iii) the date on which the authority set out in the resolution is revoked or varied by way of an ordinary resolution passed by the Shareholders in a general meeting. The existing mandates granted to the Directors to issue and to repurchase Shares shall expire at the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting. With reference to the Repurchase Mandate and the Issue Mandate, the Directors wish to state that they have no immediate plan to repurchase any Shares or issue any Shares pursuant thereto, if such mandate is granted.

9. RECOMMENDATIONS

The Directors consider that the above proposals are in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole. Accordingly, the Directors recommend that all Shareholders vote in favour of the resolutions to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting.

In order to qualify for attending and voting at the annual general meeting, all transfer documents should be lodged for registration with the Company’s branch share registrar and transfer office in Hong Kong, Tricor Progressive Limited, at Level 22, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen’s Road East, Hong Kong on or before 4:30 p.m., Thursday, 29 May 2014.
- (ii) Any member entitled to attend and vote at a general meeting of the Company shall be entitled to appoint another person as his proxy to attend and vote instead of him. A member who is the holder of two or more Shares may appoint more than one proxy to represent him and vote on his behalf at a general meeting of the Company or at a class meeting. A proxy need not be a member. In addition, a proxy or proxies representing either a member who is an individual or a member which is a corporation shall be entitled to exercise the same powers on behalf of the member which he or they represent as such member could exercise.

NON-EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR:

Mr. MA Wangjun, aged 49, was appointed as a non-executive Director and a member of the audit committee of the Board with effect from 28 August 2012. He is a director of Achieve Bloom Limited, the controlling shareholder of the Company. Mr. Ma joined COFCO Corporation in August 1988 and is currently the chief accountant of COFCO Corporation. He is a qualified senior accountant in the PRC and has extensive experience in corporate finance and asset management. He is a non-executive director of China Agri-Industries Holdings Limited (stock code: 00606), a company listed on the Main Board of the Stock Exchange and was a non-executive director of China Mengniu Dairy Company Limited (stock code: 02319), a company listed on the Main Board of the Stock Exchange, from March 2010 to April 2012. This appendix serves as the explanatory statement required to be sent to Shareholders by the Listing Rules in connection with the proposed Repurchase Mandate to be granted to the Directors.

At the Annual General Meeting, an ordinary resolution will be proposed that the Directors be given a general and unconditional mandate to exercise all powers of the Company to repurchase Shares representing up to a maximum of 10% of the aggregate amount of the issued ordinary share capital of the Company on the date of the Annual General Meeting where the relevant resolution is proposed to be passed.

NUMBER OF SHARES PROPOSED TO BE REPURCHASED

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the number of Shares in the issued ordinary share capital of the Company was 8,478,732,480 Shares. Subject to the passing of the proposed resolution and on the basis that there will be no change in respect of the issued ordinary share capital of the Company between the Latest Practicable Date and the date of the Annual General Meeting where the relevant resolution is proposed to be passed, the Company would be allowed to repurchase a maximum of 847,873,248 Shares, being 10% of the issued ordinary share capital of the Company.

REASONS FOR REPURCHASES

The Directors believe that it is in the best interests of the Company and its Shareholders to have a general authority from Shareholders to enable the Directors to repurchase Shares on the market. Depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, repurchases of Shares may enhance the Company's net asset value and/or earnings per Share. Shareholders can be assured that the Directors would only make such purchases in circumstances where they consider the purchases to be in the best interests of the Company and its Shareholders, and where the Shares can be purchased on favourable terms.

IMPACT ON WORKING CAPITAL

On the basis of the Company's financial position as at the Latest Practicable Date, if the Repurchase Mandate were exercised in full at any time during the proposed repurchase period, there would be no material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels as compared with the most recent published audited accounts of the Group as at 31 December 2013.

FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

The Company is empowered by its memorandum of association and Bye-laws to purchase its Shares. In repurchasing Shares, the Company may only apply funds legally available for such purpose in accordance with its memorandum of association and Bye-laws and the laws of Bermuda. The Directors propose that the repurchase of Shares under the Repurchase Mandate will be financed from distributable profits or proceeds of a fresh issue of ordinary shares of the Company and its subsidiaries made for the purpose of funding the repurchase.

DIRECTORS, THEIR ASSOCIATES AND CONNECTED PERSONS

None of the Directors, nor, to the best of the knowledge and belief of the Directors having made all reasonable enquiries, any of the Associates of the Directors, have any present intention, in the event that the proposal is approved by Shareholders, to sell Shares to the Company.

No persons who are Connected Persons of the Company have notified the Company that they have a present intention to sell Shares to the Company nor have they undertaken not to sell any of the Shares held by them to the Company in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

UNDERTAKING

The Board has undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, so far as the same may be applicable, it will exercise the proposed Repurchase Mandate only in accordance with the Listing Rules, all applicable laws of Bermuda and the regulations set out in the memorandum of association of the Company and Bye-laws.

CONTROLLING SHAREHOLDER

If as a result of a share repurchase by the Company, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purpose of the Takeovers Code. Accordingly a Shareholder, or a group of Shareholders acting in concert (within the meaning under the Takeovers Code), depending on the level of increase of its or their interests, could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and thereby become obliged to make mandatory offer in accordance with Rules 26 and 32 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, to the best of the knowledge and belief of the Directors, Achieve Bloom Limited, which held 75% of the issued ordinary share capital of the Company, was the only substantial Shareholder holding 10% or more of the issued ordinary share capital of the Company. In the event that the Directors exercised in full the power to repurchase Shares which is proposed to be granted pursuant to the resolution and assuming there is no change in the issued ordinary share capital of the Company, the shareholding of Achieve Bloom Limited in the Company would be increased to approximately 83.33% of the issued ordinary share capital of the Company. The Directors believe that such an increase is not expected to give rise to an obligation on Achieve Bloom Limited to make a mandatory offer under Rule 26 or 32 of the Takeovers Code. The Directors have no intention to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent so that a general offer obligation is triggered, or so that the Company is not able to maintain the minimum prescribed public float.
